Common Questions on NCLB School Choice

What services are available if I keep my child in his/her home school?

Every school offers extended learning opportunities (before, after school, or summer) for students. These services are free to all students. In some cases, supplemental educational services are offered from external education groups.

How did my home school become a school on program improvement?

A school not making “adequate yearly progress” (achievement increases set by NCLB) for two consecutive years is placed on program improvement. This academic growth is measured on the state criterion reference test.

Will my home school always be in program improvement?

Schools can make it off program improvement by making “adequate yearly progress” two consecutive years in a row. Each school on program improvement is required to present an improvement plan describing how to address improving student achievement.

How do I enroll my child into another school?

To make application for your child to be transferred to a receiving school based on NCLB school choice guidelines, a parent must fill out the NCLB school choice application. This application is available on this website or at the office of your home school.

Can I make application for school choice any time during the school year?

No, application periods are advertised by each individual school (usually 30 calendar days) and must be received at your home school office prior to that date.

Can I move back to my home school during the school year?

Yes, but not encouraged. We believe multiple moves during a school year can cause a disruption to the learning process.
