



## **Ogden City School District No Child Left Behind Information**

### **School Choice under NCLB**

Under the guidelines of the No Child Left Behind Act, parents have the option of School Choice. Parents that have children attending a Title I school which did not make “adequate yearly progress” for two or more consecutive years may qualify to exercise the school choice option. Parents interested in sending their child to a receiving school may make a school choice application during the advertised time period. The applications are available online at this web site or through your home school office.

Applications are received by the home school and choice is granted based on funding available. Transitions will be handled in a timely manner to ensure the smooth transfer of services. Receiving schools will be determined by the district based on space availability and proximity to the sending school.

Transportation may be provided by the school district based on the guidelines of the State Office of Education. Generally, if the receiving school is located at least 1.5 miles (2 miles for secondary) from the student’s home, transportation may be made available. This decision is made at the time of application approval.

Parents that choose to remain at their home school and participate in the school improvement process will have extended day learning options to choose from. Parents wishing to be involved in the school program improvement process, please contact your community council parent representatives.
